

# Significant Events and/or Alarms

• Chief Drake successfully submitted a Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) regional application on the behalf of the 13 fire departments north of Four Mile Road in Kent County, except for one department, Spencer FD. These 13 agencies were queried about their needs and interest to supplement their ventilation fan inventory with a 120VAC/ 12VDC fan. All members affirmed their desire to participate and provided necessary data under the AFG guidelines. Chief Drake submitted this application on February 1, 2018. Total time invested in this task is about 30 hours. Matching fund responsibility for a successful application is about \$800.00 for Solon FD.

- SFD also submitted necessary data to participate in an additional FEMA AFG regional application authored by Capt. David Barnes of the Cedar Springs Fire Department. This regional request includes the Sand Lake Fire Department, Solon Fire Department, and the City of Cedar Springs Fire Department. This grant is seeking funding for the purchase of new SCBA's for all three departments. If the grant is approved, Solon FD will be responsible for matching 10% of the alarm which totals to about \$ 11,000.00 for 16 new SCBAs.
- The Breathing Air Compressor install project has been progressing slowly. Three vendor quotes for labor costs and materials to make the electrical connections to the compressor have been obtained. This connection includes three different options for obtaining the necessary 3-phase power to run the compressor:
  - With a new phase converter
  - With a used phase converter
  - Without a phase converter and obtaining 3 phase power from the building stand-by generator

This item will be on the agenda for the February Staff Meeting.

- Both Automatic External Defibrillators (AED) received software upgrades from the manufacturer (warranty).
- All SCBA batteries were replaced as scheduled every six months
- SFD responded to a single car versus tree, fatal, motor vehicle accident on January 7, 2018 requiring the use of the hydraulic rescue tools to free the victim.
- The alarm graphs above are correct, SFD did not receive or give mutual aid to any alarm to any
  department in January 2018. This is indicative of the rather substantial reduction in call volume for
  January.
- A new candidate is on the agenda for the Board to consider hiring in February upon the Chief's
  recommendation. This candidate, Jason Blalock, is a resident of Winston View and brings both a
  current Medical license and is a state certified firefighter.
